
2022 Loon Observations on Jack Lake



Summary Prepared by Steven Kerr December 2022



Introduction

Volunteers have recorded loon observations on Jack Lake for many years as part of the Canada Lakes Loon Survey (see References). Information is collected in two formats. Participants dedicate at least three days to survey the entire lake in June (to see if loon pairs are on territory), July (to see if chicks have hatched) and August (to see if chicks have survived long enough to fledge). Other random sitings throughout the season are used to supplement lakewide surveys and to determine arrival and departure dates.

This report has been prepared to summarize loon observations recorded on Jack Lake in 2022.

2022 Loon Observations

Loons typically arrive in the spring coincident with ice thaw which usually occurs in April. The first reported loon siting in 2022 was on April 10. Ice out on Jack Lake occurred on April 12, 2022 (JLA 2022).

Three lakewide surveys were conducted in 2022 (Table 1).

Based on a consolidation and review of all information documented during the 2022 season, key loon observations have been summarized in Table 2.

Lake surface area and shoreline configuration often determines the number of loons which can live and breed on a lake (Loon Watch 1994). Jack Lake is a relatively large (1,237.3 ha) and diverse lake which has a complex basin comprised of numerous bays connected to each other by shallow channels. During the 2022 season, parents with young-of-year were observed in six discrete areas of the lake.

Loons are known to sometimes gather into groups during the summer (Canadian Wildlife Service 1994). This activity was observed on three occasions during 2022. On July 24, a group of six adult loons was observed. In mid August, groups of nine and thirteen loons were observed in Robbins Bay and Sheeps Bay, respectively.

Adult loons are the first to migrate in the fall. In 2022, adult loons were not observed on Jack Lake after late September. Juvenile (i.e., young-of-year) loons were observed on the lake until December 1. The lake was frozen by Christmas.
